
THE DEADLY COUNTERFEIT DRUG TRADE THRIVES IN TENNESSEE

Counterfeit pills, intravenous and injectable medications have injured and even killed Tennessee patients.

Counterfeit drug smugglers lined their own pockets by infiltrating the illicit opioid market and the prescription drug supply to the detriment of Tennessee's residents.

Unregulated prescription drugs—counterfeit Avastin, fake Botox, and others—have sprung up in communities across Tennessee. Between 2012 and 2016, 52 different medical practices in Tennessee were among more than 3,000 nationwide that were implicated in various black-market supply chains associated with counterfeit cancer treatments and other therapies. In 2012, Dr. William Kincaid, a Johnson City oncologist, pleaded guilty to using non FDA-approved medicines on his patients. Families of his patients will never be sure whether their loved one's lives were cut short by fake medicines smuggled into the country by profiteers.

Since 2015, the country has seen a terrible upsurge in counterfeit prescription pills laced with fentanyl or its deadlier variants. Even a fraction of a single pill can mean death in less than 30 minutes of ingesting it. In July 2017, police in Coalmont arrested two individuals who allegedly distributed over 100,000 illegal prescription pills and counterfeit pills made with fentanyl. On a single day in June 2016, authorities in Rutherford County saw 15 overdoses and one death caused by counterfeit Percocet pills laced with fentanyl. Newspapers have reported deaths in Antioch, Clarksville and Murfreesboro, but many more Tennessee residents have likely died of fentanyl poisoning after encountering these pills because not all pill deaths are investigated for counterfeit drugs, and not all families publicly share their losses.³

The only way to protect Americans from these dangers is to protect and strengthen the closed U.S. supply chain, which holds drug manufacturers accountable for safety regulations.
